

## Day tour the Reykjanes Peninsula

In our private day tours, we stop by the best bakery in Iceland on our way out of town or from the airport and buy you a cup of coffee, tea, or hot chocolate and a special Icelandic treat. ### Tour highlights:

#### Day tour around the Reykjanes Peninsula.

- Pick up from your hotel in the vicinity of Reykjavik or directly from Keflavik Airport.
- You choose if we stop by a bakery for a cup of coffee, tea, or hot chocolate with a special Icelandic treat or have breakfast at the **Viking museum**, where the Viking ship **Íslendingur** is on display.
- The **Bridge Between Continents** is a man-made tourist attraction but, nevertheless, a very interesting one and worth visiting.
- **Gunnhver** is a very powerful “ghost” hot spring.
- **Reykjanestá** is the edge of the peninsula with a beautiful ocean view.
- We visit the splashing waves at **Brimketill**.
- Short hike around **Seltún**, a colorful geothermal area.
- View over **Lake Kleifarvatn**.
- Drive through **Hafnarfjörður**, the town of elves and Vikings.
- We pay **Bessastaðir** a visit where the president of Iceland lives, and see if he is in.
- Drop off at your hotel or at the airport.

After an early pickup from the airport, we are usually in Reykjavik at around 3 p.m. in time for check-in at the hotels.

After a pickup from a hotel in the vicinity of Reykjavik, we aim to be at the airport around 2:30 p.m. to catch a 5:00 o'clock flight!
